Teaser	Legal entities within the meaning of Section 33 of the German Commercial Code (HGB) with main branches abroad must register branches in Germany for entry in the commercial register. Registration is mandatory for those persons who would also be obliged to do so under German law.
Volltext	Legal entities within the meaning of Section 33 of the German Commercial Code (HGB) with main branches abroad must register branches in Germany for entry in the commercial register. Registration is mandatory for those persons who would also be obliged to do so under German law. The management board applies for registration in the commercial register via a notary at the registration court in whose district the branch office is established. A business must also be registered for the branch





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	office with the trade office of the respective city or municipality.
	Note: The branch office is registered with the register court responsible for the location of the branch office. In Saxony, the management of the commercial register is concentrated in the district courts of Chemnitz, Dresden and Leipzig.
	Single point of contact
	You can utilise the service of the Single Point of Contact for this procedure. They will guide you through the process, take care of correspondence with all the authorities responsible for your matter and provide you with expert advice.

	<ul> <li>Company name, attached company suffix (if available)</li> <li>Place and domestic business address of the branch office</li> </ul>
	The notary will inform you which documents and details are required for registration in each individual case.
Voraussetzungen	Insofar as foreign law does not require any deviations, the regulations for head offices or branches at the company's registered office apply. This applies to
	<ul> <li>registrations,</li> <li>filings,</li> <li>registrations and</li> <li>announcements concerning the branch office of a legal entity.</li> </ul>

Kosten	<ul> <li>Fee for registration in accordance with the Court and Notary Costs Act in conjunction with the Ordinance on Fees in Commercial, Partnership and Co-operative Register Matters</li> <li>Expenses for the public announcement</li> </ul>
Verfahrensablauf	To submit an application, contact a notary.
	<ul> <li>The notary will advise you on how to formulate the application.</li> <li>The application is made exclusively electronically and a publicly notarised document is created for this purpose. From 1 August 2022, the document can also be notarised via video communication.</li> <li>The declaration is provided with an electronic signature (within the meaning of Section 39a Beurkundungsgesetz/BeurkG) and sent to the electronic court and administrative mailbox of the registry court.</li> <li>You will receive a notification that the entry has been made.</li> <li>Amendments</li> <li>Have key details about your company, such as the registered office, legal form or authorised representatives, changed? Then please have the register entry corrected immediately.</li> <li>The entry is made in the same way exclusively via a notary.</li> </ul>
