### **Sachverhalt**

# Volltext

- have resided permanently in Germany for at least three years, have been gainfully employed in Germany or in another Member State of the European Union for the last twelve months and have since retired from working life due to your age (reaching the age of 65) or due to an early retirement scheme;
- You have given up your job in Germany or in another Member State of the European Union as a result of total incapacity for work caused by an accident at work or an occupational disease and which gives you the right to a pension in Germany;
- you have given up your job in Germany or another Member State of the European Union as a result of total incapacity for work after having previously resided in Germany for at least two years, or
- have been continuously employed in Germany for three years, are now employed in another Member State of the European Union, but still have a residence in Germany to which you return at least once a week. Citizens of the European Union (EU) and the European Economic Area (EEA: Norway, Iceland and Liechtenstein) do not generally require a residence permit to enter and stay in Germany.

# Erforderliche Unterlagen

- Recognized or otherwise approved valid passport or passport substitute
- Proof that the right to freedom of movement was exercised for the period of residence completed (e.g. confirmation of registration, employment contract, trade license or proof of self-employment, sufficient means of subsistence and sufficient health insurance cover, certificate of enrollment)

Consent of the legal representative to the planned stay if the person is under 18 years of age

### Voraussetzungen

- You are a national of the EU or EEA
- You can prove that you have spent the required period of residence in Germany (usually five years, but in special cases two or three years are sufficient).
- You are staying in Germany legally, which means that you have fulfilled the requirements of the right of freedom of movement throughout your entire stay.
- If necessary, you can provide the evidence and documents listed under "Required documents"

Verfahrensablauf	<ul> <li>Depending on the immigration authority, it may be possible to apply online. Find out whether your immigration authority offers electronic application. If you apply electronically, the immigration authority will contact you after receiving your application to request additional documents if necessary and to arrange an appointment with you at the immigration authority. Your documents will be checked during the appointment (bring the originals with you to the appointment if you are asked to do so).</li> <li>If the application can only be submitted in person, make an appointment with the immigration office. During the appointment, your information will be received and your documents checked (bring the originals with you to the appointment if you are asked to do so).</li> <li>Once the examination is complete, you will immediately be issued with a certificate of permanent residence or a rejection notice.</li> <li>The collection must always be done in person. You must sign at the immigration office.</li> </ul>
Bearbeitungsdauer	Your application for a certificate of permanent residence will be processed as soon as possible.
Frist	The certificate of permanent residence can be applied for after five years of permanent legal residence. In special cases, permanent residence can be certified after just two or three years.

Rechtsbehelf	An appeal against the negative decision can be lodged with the authority within one month after notification.
Kurztext	<ul> <li>Certificate of permanent residence issued to Union citizens entitled to freedom of movement</li> <li>After five years of permanent, legal residence in Germany, nationals of the European Union (EU) or a state of the European Economic Area (EEA: Norway, Iceland and Liechtenstein) can acquire permanent residence rights and apply for a certificate of permanent residence rights.</li> <li>No continuous stay in Germany required</li> <li>Under certain conditions, permanent residence permits can be acquired before the five-year period has elapsed; the competent immigration authority will determine whether an exception applies.</li> <li>Certificate serves only to confirm that the right of permanent residence has been acquired (not an administrative act)</li> <li>For persons under the age of 18, the consent of a legal guardian is required.</li> </ul>
